John Bindela, who is also committed and dedicated to our community, worked within strict budget limitations to maximize the needed repairs and replacements. There are still some rails in need of repairs, but most of the major work was done this spring thanks to the extra time and resources spent on this part of the program by KRVC and John Bindela.
